To reflect recent developments in Canadian law, the following additions and corrections should be made to *Is that legal?* (changes in bold):

Page 2:

Effective March 10, 2015, it is a criminal offence to post, send or share an intimate image of someone without their consent, including by text, email, or social media. This is true even if the person depicted is over the age of 18.
