



# POWER PLAY

*Designed to supplement the Law 12 and Social Justice 12 curricula, this workshop explores how the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms applies to our daily lives.*

## ABOUT THIS WORKSHOP

This workshop explores the law, discrimination, and marginalization. Students are encouraged to critically examine social conventions and their own (mis)conceptions about equality. It includes games and activities to start discussions about discrimination and its implications and introduces the *Charter of Rights and Freedoms* and section 15 (the equality rights provision).

## CURRICULUM

The workshop was developed for students taking Law 12 or Social Justice 12 in British Columbia. However, it can be booked for other classes and groups as well! The curriculum is available on our website; anyone is welcome to use it in their classroom. Please let us know if you do!
